

It has been a tough start to 2021 from a boating weather perspective, though as the northern hemisphere moves closer to the sun, improvement is surely in our near-term future! In the meantime, we have been fortunate to have our ABC Hilton Head education program well underway, with very active participation.

After our run of seminars, we are now in the midst of the Marine Electrical Systems course, which is very capably taught by Cecil Viverette. Cecil also has a great bag of electrical motors, wires, testers and the like, to provide live demonstrations of what he is teaching. Eight people are registered, a number of whom are working toward their Inland Navigator designation, which requires a successful pass of this course. Following in March will be the Engine Maintenance course, another one required for IN. It begins March 11 and will be taught by Larry Tremitiere. Since we have a limit on the size of in-person classes of ten, if you are interested please sign up as soon as you can.

Speaking of the Inland Navigator certification, the weather has played havoc with our efforts to conduct the On-the-Water exam that is part of IN. We do, however, have eight qualified candidates, and are hoping to complete this in March sometime. We have learned through this process as well, that we are short of accredited examiners for OTW certifications. We are hoping that at least several of those who complete IN will then undertake the training to become certifiers for our local area.

Also related to OTW training, the USPS has revamped its' on-the-water general training, which now goes by the new acronym HOT, for Hands-on-Training. This is not a certification, but rather several two-hour teaching sessions in members boats, which targets training skills in docking, undocking, use of navigational aids and route selection, and boat handling. It's a great opportunity to demonstrate the skills taught in our Boat Handling seminars, and we hope to roll this out as the weather gets better.

Finally, another reminder of the America's Boating Course (ABC) being held in two separate sessions on **Saturday**, **March 20 and 27**. This is the best possible introduction to boating in the Low Country for new boaters, as well as the number one way we have of attracting new members to ABC Hilton Head. Please actively promote it with your neighbors and acquaintances. Those passing the class exam will also receive their South Carolina Boaters Card. Signup for ABC, as well as our other courses and seminars, on our website at <u>abchh.org</u>.
