ABCHH CELEBRATES THE SEASON WITH THE SHORE NOTES AT OUR ANNUAL HOLIDAY DINNER


For the second year in a row members and guests enjoyed listening to holiday tunes performed by an ensemble from the Shore Notes. It was a very festive evening minus the snow.
