Online Education from Americas Boating Channel

With the current Stay at Home and Work order from the State, we have had to suspend all our planned courses and seminars for this spring. Hopefully, we will be able to reschedule everything, though it will depend on timing as to when things begin to return to normal.

In the meantime, a great option to build your boating knowledge, and keep your skills up to date, is to watch the programs and training videos offered on Americas Boating Channel, the content of which is provided by the United States Power Squadrons. To access the channel, go to <u>americasboatingchannel.com</u>, or search for it on YouTube.

On the channel, you will find an extensive library of short instructional videos on many topics, including boat handling, docking, anchoring, and managing various sea conditions.

Also, for the period that our current restrictions remain in place, the USPS is also offering a weekly hosted program of close to an hour, on a range of boating topics and interests. Episode 1 was posted last week, and it's our understanding that there will be a new episode each week for the near future.

We have now received the results from the Boat Handling exams held in February. This was the exam that covers the material in the new six seminar series on practical aspects of Boat Handling ... Including Rules of the Road, Docking, Boating Under Power, Anchoring, Emergencies on Board, and Lines and Knots. Persons passing the exam are awarded the designation of "S" on their USPS records; this is the replacement for the previous Seamanship course.

The course and seminars were very well received - Not least because of the excellent teaching by Mark Larson, Al Pepe, Klaus Loehr, Walter Kirk, and Peter Dion.
