

Partner in Command. I say this is one of our more important seminars was canceled for lack of attendance... Partner in Command. I say this is one of our more important seminars because it provides you with lifesaving information that will make you a more confident boater in an emergency situation. What if...the captain (husband, spouse, significant other) of the boat you are in suddenly becomes incapacitated (heart attack, falls overboard, heat exhaustion, broken body part, etc.)? Will you as the first mate know what to do? Do you know where you are? What's your Lat and Lon? How do you help the captain? What do you do first? How do you call for help? Who do you call? Marine radio...how do I use it? What do I say? Can you stop the boat? Can you drive the boat to get back to the dock in rough weather? Provide first aid? Where is the first aid kit?

These are just several things to think about in an emergency situation. All of these topics are presented and discussed in **Partner in Command**. After reading this and if you would like to take this seminar ask our Education Officer, Tom Ryley, if another class can be scheduled. This is an important seminar for your safety! I highly recommend it.

Finally, I hope to see you on the water soon!

Happy New Year to all our members, and best wishes for 2021, as we work to keep things as normal as possible for ABC Hilton Head, in very abnormal times!

We are happy to report that our 2021 education program is underway, and we have now completed two successful seminars. On January 11, Hal Wilson taught by Zoom the VHF/DSC Radio seminar, and we had 11 attendees with very active questioning.

Then on January 18, we held the Using GPS seminar at the Senior Center, and we were very fortunate to have Dennis Cusanelli of the Tybee Light squadron come to present a program that he personally developed. It is very much up to date with all the recent developments in GPS. Being an in-person class, we were limited to 10 attendees, but it was very well received. We hope to soon offer the seminar again as we had a waiting list.

In terms of upcoming courses and seminars, Partner in Command (cancelled) and the next seminar -- Onboard Weather Forecasting will be February 1, led by former Commander Mark Larson. Our first course will then commence January 28. Marine Electrical Systems (MES) will be taught by Cecil Viverette. For anyone who is interested in the Inland Navigator designation, MES is a required course, so we would encourage you to enroll in this session. (You will also learn a lot about electricity and batteries, which is great knowledge for all boaters.)

Beyond the above, our full calendar of courses and seminars is posted on the <u>abchh.org</u> website, under the Education menu, and members can enroll directly through the website, as well as in response to the emails we do a month before every course or seminar. Also, if you can't remember exactly what you have taken in the past, the website has a link to help look up your Training History on the National USPS website.

As to additional education offerings in 2021, we are still working to develop a stronger "OTW" (On-the-Water) component to our program, including JumpStart, Hands-On Training (HOT), and the Boat Operator Certification offerings. We will be publicizing those more fully when they are "ready to roll."

Finally, we would like to note that the first sessions of America's Boating Course will be held March 20 and 27. These are not only excellent for anyone new to boating, but are also a great source for introducing new members to our squadron. Please promote these actively with interested friends and acquaintances, and tell them they can sign up on our web site.

Thank you again for your support, and we look forward to seeing you during the year.


